Dear IIHCP Associate in Nursing Students:

As part of our commitment to securing the highest level of accreditation and quality within our nursing programs, we have made the difficult decision to cease offering the current ASN (i.e., Associate degree only) program at this time (we intend to offer an ASN program again in the future). The institution's operations will otherwise continue as normal; the school is merely ceasing the enrollment of new students into the current ASN program. Students who are currently enrolled in the program will be unaffected, and will continue with their studies, as planned. Once all academic requirements and financial obligations of the program are satisfied, the current students will be eligible to graduate and challenge the NCLEX-RN.

Key Points for current ASN students:

1. No disruption to your current course sequence or graduation timeline, provided you remain in good academic standing and satisfy all financial obligations.
2. Continued access to all student support resources (e.g., academic advising, tutoring, bursar department).
3. Clear academic advising to ensure you meet all graduation requirements within the available time frame.
4. Ongoing communication and assistance from the program leadership and advising team.
5. Students are still required to meet the satisfactory academic requirements and graduation requirements.
6. After successful completion of the program, the school will send all documentation to the Florida Board of Nursing necessary for you to challenge the NCLEX-RN.

Please note: The program retains its FBON approval status for the duration of the teach-out. However, FBON's website may list the program as being "closed." This is only to alert the public that this program is closed to new enrollments. An indication by the FBON that the program is "closed" does not in any way affect the validity of your transcripts and diplomas, or your ability to complete the program as expected and to seek licensure in Florida as a Registered Nurse.
